



2 Part Workshop Invitation: View Video Invitation Here

The <u>UArctic Thematic Network "Global Ecological and Economic Connections in Arctic and sub-Arctic Crab</u> <u>Fisheries"</u> *invites expressions of interest in participation* in either or both parts of a <u>2 Part Virtual Workshop</u> <u>on Arctic and sub-Arctic crab markets and research</u>. The overall goal of the network is to understand the ecological shifts in marine productivity and/or economic transformations in fisheries markets that we expect due to climate change, technological developments, and shifts in consumer preferences. **Contact: Professor Brooks Kaiser, baka@sam.sdu.dk**

Workshop Part 1: Videos. Participants in Part 1 of the workshop will create short (2 to 10 minute) video presentations of their engagement with crab research and/or the uses and impacts of the crabs in their environs (e.g. fishing, tourism, art/music, auction markets, consumption). These asynchronous workshop participation videos will be shared privately with participants before the 2nd part of the workshop. After Part 2, unless a participant needs to keep their presentation confidential for any reason, the videos will be released publicly as an output of the workshop. While they can be as simple as a recording of yourself speaking to the camera on your phone, there are some video ideas (and software/instructions) in the above invitation (e.g. Doodly) and here: ESSAS 2021 Presentation (academic, e.g powerpoint or google slides), Belmont Forum Video Report 2020, (academic dissemination, e.g. Magix or Adobe Premiere Pro), or journalistic (with a little sensationalism), and if you really must, you can go full <u>Gordon Ramsay</u>.

Workshop Part 2: Dialogue and Research Advancement. The videos will be followed by live online meeting times spread over the course of 2 days (on zoom) dedicated to integrating the asynchronous information into draft outputs for dissemination and follow-up research. With interested parties around the globe, there are very few (ok, really no) great hours for meeting times for everyone, so there will of necessity be different groups meeting with each other at different times. Timings will be determined by matching video preparers' locations in clusters that develop from the video content. Video contributions do not formally mandate participation in the online workshop, and vice-versa, but participation in both is highly encouraged.

There is funding support of approximately 600 Euros/participant for video preparation and/or participation. Russian or Russian-related research may receive additional funding from earmarked IASC funds. A special issue in the <u>Aquatic Foods section of Frontiers in Sustainable Food Systems</u> is in development for publishing workshop outputs in 2022.

Online workshop dates: December 9 and December 16, 2021. Confirm participation with Brooks Kaiser by October 27 to be considered for funding support.

Guidance for the video preparation: Please address the overarching questions of

- 1. how you are engaged in the biological, ecological, economic and/or social components of Arctic and sub-Arctic crab research,
- 2. what main interdisciplinary questions you wish to engage in to achieve greater understanding of the connections amongst these components and the changes they are undergoing.
